

VFW Hosts 10 Student Veterans to Storm Capitol Hill

Legislative Fellowship brings 10 student veteran leaders to Washington

WASHINGTON – On Sunday, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. (VFW) will bring 10 student veteran leaders to the nation's capital to meet face-to-face with legislators, advocating on behalf of the veterans' community for the inaugural VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship program. Throughout the week the Fellows will be seamlessly integrated into the VFW's National Legislative Conference, during which more than 500 VFW advocates will converge on Capitol Hill to deliver the VFW's legislative agenda for 2015.

The inaugural VFW-SVA Legislative Fellows were selected in collaboration with Student Veterans of America (SVA), through which the VFW and SVA identified 10 exemplary student veterans who demonstrated leadership potential on their campuses and a desire to advocate on behalf of their fellow veterans.

"With more than a century of experience advocating for our veterans, the VFW now seeks to share what we have learned over the years with a new generation of veteran leaders," said VFW National Commander John W. Stroud, a retired Air Force first sergeant who earned a bachelor's degree in professional aeronautics from Embry-Riddle University. "Our inaugural VFW-SVA Legislative Fellows are already advocating for the needs of their fellow veterans on their college campuses and in their communities, which is why we look forward to sharing ideas and inspiring them to continue serving their fellows veterans through this unique experience."

"Student Veterans of America is proud to partner with the VFW to provide student veterans with the opportunity to make their voices heard on Capitol Hill," said the SVA President and CEO, D. Wayne Robinson. "The VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship program depicts the best of what SVA is as a coalition—a demonstration of the collective strength of our organization,

as well as the unique, individual contribution that each student veteran makes in this country. SVA looks forward to welcoming our 2015 Fellows to the nation's capital and remains committed to providing the support and resources needed to ensure that student veterans achieve their dreams and, in the process, brighten America's future."

During their visit to Washington, each Fellow will be paired with a VFW mentor and accompany their VFW state delegation around Capitol Hill for in-person meetings with their members of Congress. The Fellows will also receive briefings from the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department of Labor on ongoing policy initiatives, as well as briefings on ways to work constructively with the media when advocating for veterans' policy initiatives.

The Fellows will also join VFW Commander-in-Chief John Stroud for his testimony before a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees, and participate in the VFW's congressional reception on Wednesday night. The theme of this year's conference is "The Long Road Home," which will demonstrate to Congress that the obligation to serve the needs of the veteran's community endures long after armed conflict ends.
